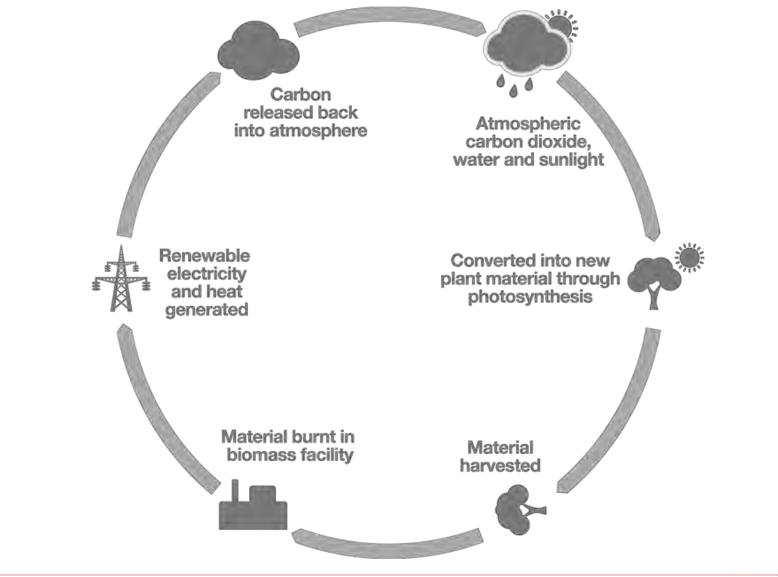


What is a biomass energy plant?

- 1. Renewable energy plant qualifying for Renewable Obligations Order
- 2. Counts towards national and regional renewable energy targets
- 3. 90% of energy input must be from a biomass source
- 4. In this case biomass is recycled and virgin timber, and energy crops
- 5. Classification of recycled wood as "waste" means WID compliance required
- 6. Fuel is burnt in boiler to create steam
- 7. Steam is used to drive a turbine which generates electricity
- 8. Electricity is exported to the national grid with a 20MWe plant generating enough renewable electricity to power 37,000 homes
- 9. Ash from the wood fuel is either removed from the bottom of the furnace or removed from the combustion gases using a bag filter
- 10. The remaining flue gas is treated to meet the requirements of the Environment Agency and dispersed via a chimney

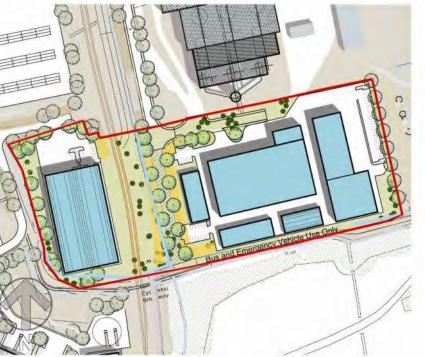

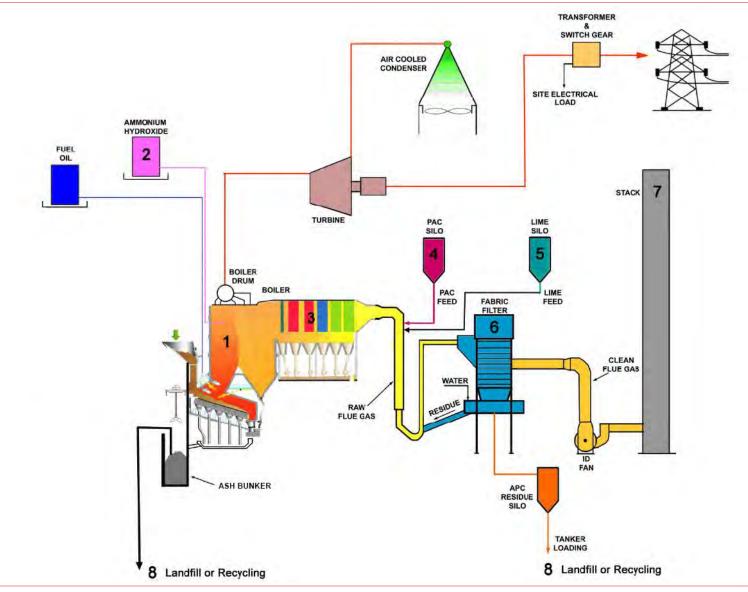

Air Quality

- All waste facilities in the UK are governed by the Environment Agency.
- All facilities operate against a strict set of conditions listed in an 'Environmental Permit' - which is monitored by the Environment Agency.
- The plant will be designed such that the impact on the local community and environment will be minimal.
- Pollution controls (emissions to air) that would be put in place:
 - Feedstock control low levels of pollutants within feedstock.
 - Combustion process controlled by state of the art technology to reduce emissions.
 - Flue gas treatment uses a complex filter system to capture and reduce the levels of pollutants.
 - Emission monitoring a continuous emission monitoring system will be used.
- Impact of plant assessed using 'Computational Atmospheric Dispersion Modelling'.
- The plant is being assessed on its own and in combination with other nearby facilities (including other elements of the Resource Recovery Park).

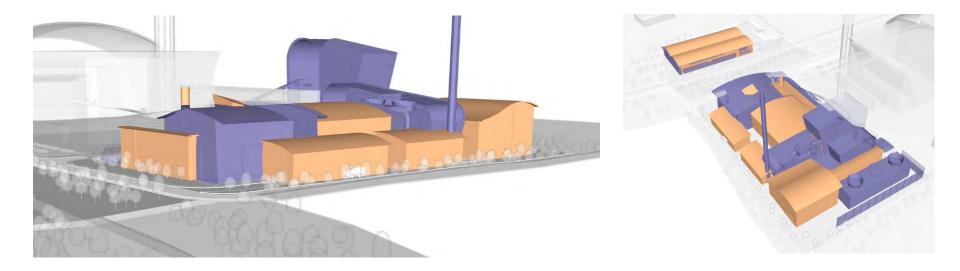

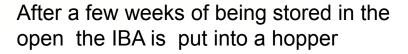

Low Carbon Footprint

- CO₂ is absorbed from atmosphere by IBA

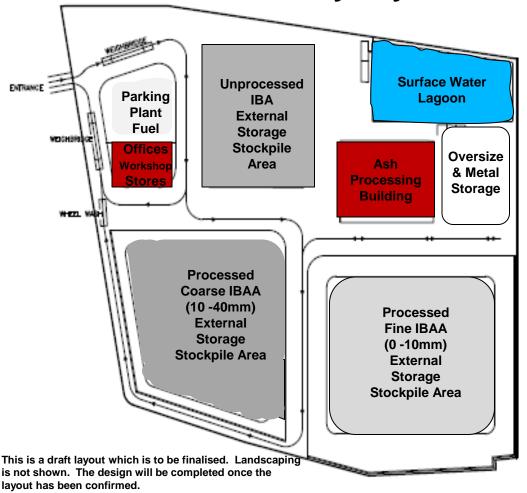
