AGM of the Ince Park Community Forum 2012-13

- 1. Apologies
- 2. The Chairman gave his Report on the activities of the Forum since the AGM June 2012 (attached)
- 3. Election of Chairman: Cllr. Tony Mills was nominated by Cllr. John Ireland and seconded by Cllr. Andrew Eardley.
 - CIIr. Mills was elected as chairman for the year 2013 to 2014
- 4. AGM Motions. No motions had been received for the AGM
- 5. Questions from members of the public: "At the Public Inquiry into the plans for the Resource Recovery Park it was stated that whilst the proposals were being considered jointly there were in fact two separate proposals for the incinerator and Resource Recovery Park and these could be considered and progress independently of each other. In view of the problems with the Incinerator is this still the case and are you proceeding with the other parts of the Park independently of the delays to, and possible scrapping of, of the incinerator proposal"

It was agreed that this issue would be covered by **MK's** presentation on the current situation in respect of Ince Park. Presentation is attached with the minutes and also on the Forum website.

This led to a discussion in which a number of questions were asked by members these include:

JI: Were Peel proposing a change of use for land at Ince Park?

MK: No – the finance from the waste contract would have provided the funds to kick-start the rest of the development. Have to think of alternative ways of funding the infrastructure.

ST: If the EfW plant and the Resource Recovery Park are separate permissions – can the RRP not be pursued.

MK: It could be advanced without the EfW plant for three years haven't been able to do anything while waiting for the Mersey waste contract. If the RRP were to go ahead before the EfW plant then planning conditions that relate more to it than the RRP might have to be looked at.

The AGM closed and the meeting went on to the June business meeting. Many of the main points had been covered in MK's presentation and the subsequent discussions.

- This is the fourth Annual General Meeting of the Ince Marshes Resource Recovery Park Community Forum.
- According to our Constitution the AGM is open to members of the public and the media. Welcome to any members of the public and media who are here
- The Forum consists of 13 voting members drawn from the parish and town councils
 of Ince, Elton, Frodsham, Helsby and Little Stanney and ward councillors from
 Cheshire West and Chester Council
- The non-voting members of the Forum consists of officers from Cheshire West and Chester, the Environment Agency, Peel Environmental and Covanta Energy UK.
 These are complemented on occasions by other specialist advisers
- Meetings of the Forum have been irregular in the past year this was determined by Covanta Energy UK waiting for the decision on the Merseyside Waste Contract.
- The decision was announced in April 2013. Covanta did not win the contract and the company has subsequently announced that it is withdrawing from the UK market and has put its UK assets up for sale.
- This includes Ince Park and until this position is resolved development at Ince Park will be limited.
- The Air Quality Monitoring Forum has had two meetings in the year, to consider and report back on the Baseline Monitoring report produced by Professor Duncan Laxen and the proposed Monitoring report.
- This work of the Air Quality Forum is now complete and has provided a valuable report on the current air quality and what monitoring will be required in the future.
- As Ince Park takes shape and construction work begins, the work of Forum in scrutinising proposals and ensuring the views of the local community are taken into account will be become more important.
