

PROTOS COMMUNITY BENEFIT FUND GUIDELINES

WHO CAN APPLY?

All not-for-profit organizations such as charities, voluntary groups, community interest companies and industrial providence societies are eligible to apply for community benefit fund support.

Applicant organisations must have a formal constitution and bank account with at least two signatories.

The Protos Community Benefit Fund covers projects which benefit communities within the boundaries of Ince, Elton, Thornton-le-Moor, Little Stanney & District and Helsby Parish Councils and Frodsham Town Council. Please see the postcode listing at the end of these guidelines to check whether your project is eligible.

The following are examples of the types of projects that the Community Benefit Fund will finance:

- Community Buildings projects which maintain and develop buildings being used and run by the community, especially projects which help ensure their sustainability for the future.
- Community transport initiatives.
- Conservation, wildlife and animal sanctuary projects.
- Education and skills development.
- The elderly projects focused on improving access to activities and services.
- Energy efficiency and environmental sustainability.
- Health and sport projects that help provide access to services that aim to improve the health and well-being of the local community.
- Heritage projects that celebrate protect and promote local culture, history and heritage.
- Regeneration community projects that help to reduce crime levels, increase employment, housing or the physical environment.
- Self-help groups community groups that deliver basic services.
- Vulnerable people projects which enable increased access to services and facilities for people
 with disabilities, the homeless and those disadvantaged.
- Young people projects which focus on improving access to services where young people can play a key role in decision making.

WHAT WILL NOT BE FUNDED?



Some suggestions of the type of projects not to be included:

- Projects outside the defined area of benefit.
- Fundraising for national or regional charities unless the funds are going directly to a group operating in the area of benefit.
- Projects that are funded by local authority or other statutory bodies or that are deemed to be the statutory obligation of the Government, local authority or agencies thereof.
- Sponsorship.
- Improvements to land that is not open to the general public.
- Projects or activities promoting political or religious objectives/buildings.
- Deficit or retrospective funding (i.e. activities that have already taken place).
- Projects or activities which conflict with the interests of the activities of Protos.
- Projects or activities which supports an individual or individuals who are not acting on behalf
 of a group or organisation with the capacity to benefit the wider community.
- Projects and activities likely to cause community disharmony.
- Applications for projects made by individuals or agencies where commission or other payment is made to that individual or agency.
- Applications for projects made by individuals or agencies for re-distribution to other separate individuals or agencies.



INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED BY APPLICANTS

In order to make a decision on the application applicants should give as much information as possible. This should include:

Need: Explain the clear need for the project and what support there is from the local community.

Use: Explain the community use of the project.

Cost: The cost of the project with budgets, realistic costs

Legacy: If projects require ongoing maintenance, applicants should explain how they plan to sustain this.

THE APPLICATION PROCESS

Applications can be submitted at any time during the year. While an organisation can submit an unlimited number of applications during the year, only **ONE** application will receive funding.

The CBF decision making panel will meet every quarter to discuss and decide on applications made during the period.

The maximum amount per applicant is £5,000 and is irrespective of the applicant's VAT status. Project costs in the application form should be shown as net of VAT for organisations able to recover VAT and as gross figures for those unable to recover.

Applications will be considered on a 'first come, first served basis'.

An application will lapse if it has not started after six months of being approved or if the project has not been completed within 12 months of approval. The panel may on a case by case basis, agree to extend these deadlines if requested by the applicant and justified by circumstances outside the applicant's control.

Applicants should submit two quotations from established companies.



The decision of the panel on applications will be final and no negotiations or appeals will be entered into with an applicant. All decisions will be reported to the Protos Community Forum.

THE DECISION MAKING PANEL

The panel will consist of the parish councilors from Ince PC, Elton PC, Frodsham TC, Helsby PC, Little Stanney and District PC and Thornton-le-Moors PC, who are representative on the Protos Community Forum. There will be one member from each council, with members from Ince and Elton sharing panel duties. In case of a voting tie – the Chairman will have the deciding vote.

THE PAYMENT PROCESS

Once approval for a scheme has been given by the panel, it is the responsibility of the applicant organization to pay for the completed works.

A member of the Benefit Fund Panel will visit the completed project and once their approval has been received payment will be organized.
